## About this Conference

Understanding and responding to the cumulative effects and impact of earlier life trauma is important when interacting with older adults who often face new traumas or stressors, including elder abuse. This conference will explore the influence of early life trauma experiences and how these incidences may influence the emotions, behaviors and health of older adults. Trauma-informed practices emphasize physical, psychological and emotional safety for both consumers and providers.

## Conference Objectives

1. Introduction to trauma and trauma-informed approaches in behavioral health and human services;
2. Participants will have a shared understanding of trauma and be able to identify examples of a traumatic event;
3. Participants will increase understanding about how prevalent trauma histories and ongoing traumas are among older adults.

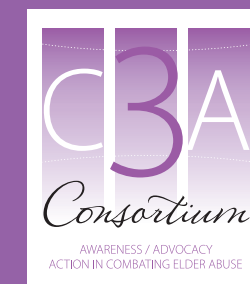
